





Explain two Muslim teachings about the Gospels (Injil) (4 marks)

Answer A: They teach that Jesus is the prophet who will return. They also teach that there are many mistakes in them.

Answer B: They teach that there are many mistakes, and the form we have is not truthful because of that. This was because they were written many years after Jesus' death by people who hadn't fully understood Jesus' message in the first place.

This means that putting anything before God (worshipping a person or money etc.) is the biggest sin and is called SHIRK. Muslims avoid falling into the trap of putting other things before God by praying 5 times a day. This gives them several opportunities a day to reflect on what is really important.

Written down by Musa's followers a long time after his death. The Zabur/ Psalms - prayers to Allah/ Poems. King Dawud. Tells about the Masih. Messiah. The Injil/ Gospel – about ISA – the Masih, born to a virgin mother. Did not die on the cross. Not the son of God. The Injil contain mistakes as were written along time after his death.

Angels are usually described as male and given male names. (Surah 53v27)

Angels are thought to be sexless.

Angels have wings, two, three or four. (Surah 35v1).
Angels must always do what Allah wants. (Surah 2v32)
Angels are made of light.

The Devil (Iblis or Shaytan for Muslims) was once an angel, who refused to bow down to Adam. For this, he was thrown out of heaven, and set up a new base in hell. The evil spirits that follow Iblis are made of fire.

Iblis tempts humans to go against Allah until the Last Day (Surah 7v11-18) (Jinns).

Muslims believe we have two guardian angels one on our right shoulder and one on our left. This is why a Muslim will turn towards each shoulder after pray to acknowledge/greet the angels.

Mika'il is as important; this is seen in the story about Muhammad as a child.

Jibril purified Muhammad's soul but he could not have done it without the water Mika'il provided. Jibril provides soul nourishment but Mika'il provides physical nourishment which is as important as

spiritual nourishment.

The angels work together to service Allah's plan. Each angel has an important part to play.

Jibril was the first thing to be created by God.

Jibril revealed the Qur'an to Muhammad.

Jibril communicates God's messages to humans, shows he is trusted completely by God.

Allah showed Jibril Heaven and Hell so that Jibril could understand the difficulty humans face in choosing to do the right thing.

On Judgement day both Jibril and Mika'il will help with the weighing of a person's actions. Mika'il has seen hell and how easy it is to get there, as opposed to how hard it is to get to paradise, so it is believed that he does not smile. He is the friend of humankind as he knows what awaits; the path to paradise being thinner than a human hair.


Mika'il: guardian of Heaven

Mika'il is the steward of Heaven, looking after the realm where Allah dwells. Mika'il is also responsible for protecting Heaven from Iblis, keeping the Devil from getting into heaven.

Jibrail: Chief of the angels

Jibrail is hugely important because he is in charge of all other angels, and is also responsible for delivering the messages of Allah to humanity. So the Qur'an recognises that Jibrail spoke to the mother of Isa (Jesus), and most importantly, Jibrail communicated the Qur'an to Muhammad (PBUH).

Read the following student sample answer:

"For Muslims Muhammad is the last and greatest of the prophets. It was Muhammad that received the teachings of the Qur'an in a series of revelations of around twenty years. The first revelation was very dramatic as the angel Jibril (Gabriel) appeared to Muhammad while he was in a cave on Mount Hira. This is known as the Night of Power. As a result of this event Muhammad started preaching that there is no other God. He spent the rest of his life in the service of God, so Muhammad is a good role model.

The Qur'an is the Muslim holy book and contains 114 chapters. Muslims are encouraged to learn Arabic so that it can be read in its original language because it their sacred book. It is said that the original Qur'an is in heaven and that it is the word of God. So the Qur'an has great authority in Islam.

In conclusion, both Muhammad and the Qur'an are extremely important in Islam. Muhammad is important because he is a prophet and the Qur'an is important because it is the most sacred holy book for Muslims."







■ Life after death

All religions believe that there will be a time of perfect peace and happiness that can be reached by living a good life on earth. For Muslims, death is not the end but the beginning of a new stage of life called **Akhirah**.

Many Muslims believe that after death the person still has a conscious existence in the grave. Here they will enter a state of waiting called 'barzakh', which means 'a barrier': no one can cross the barrier to amend things they have done wrong or warn the living. They are waiting for the Day of Judgement.

Muslims believe that as they lie in the grave, God sends two angels to question them about their faith. If people answer correctly, they will see the rewards to come, but if they deny God, they will see the punishments they will have to endure. Some believe the punishments start right away. Others think that people sleep in their graves until the end of the world when the Day of Judgement will come.
