
	Song Structure
Structure	The way sections of the song are constructed
Intro	Introduction / opening section
Verse	A main section that tells the story in the song
Chorus	A main section that repeats & is catchy
Instrumental	A section with no singing—eg. guitar solo
Bridge	A link section between main parts of song
Pre-Chorus	A section that builds into the chorus
Middle 8	A contrasting section for interest
Drum Fill	Busy drum pattern that pushes song forward
Hook	Short catchy idea eg.'We will, we will, rock you'
Outro	Ending section to song





Chords	
Triad	3 note chord on notes 1,3,5
Chord	Multiple notes played together
Major chord	4 semitones between root & 3rd
Minor chord	3 semitones between root & 3rd
Semitone	Smallest interval between 2 notes
Tone	2 semitones (a full step)
Chromatic	Moving up/down a scale in STs
Construct	Be able to construct a major or
chords-	minor chord above any note.
	(eg chord on left = E major)
