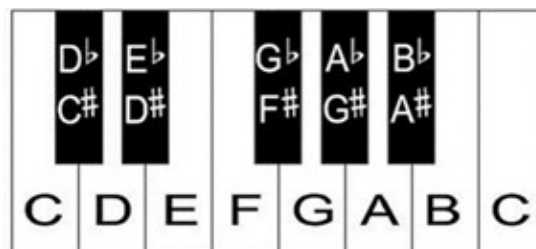
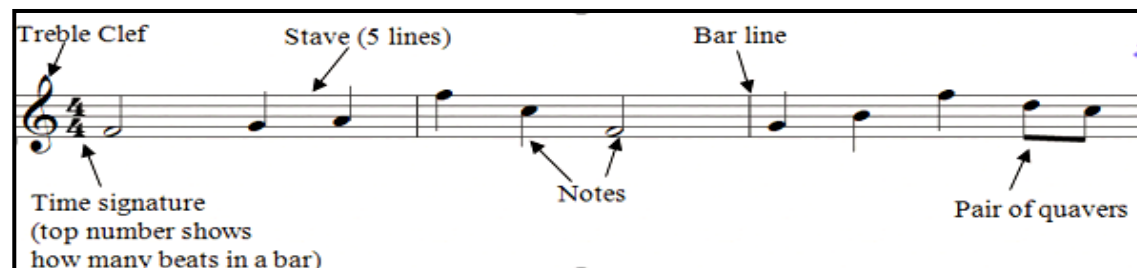

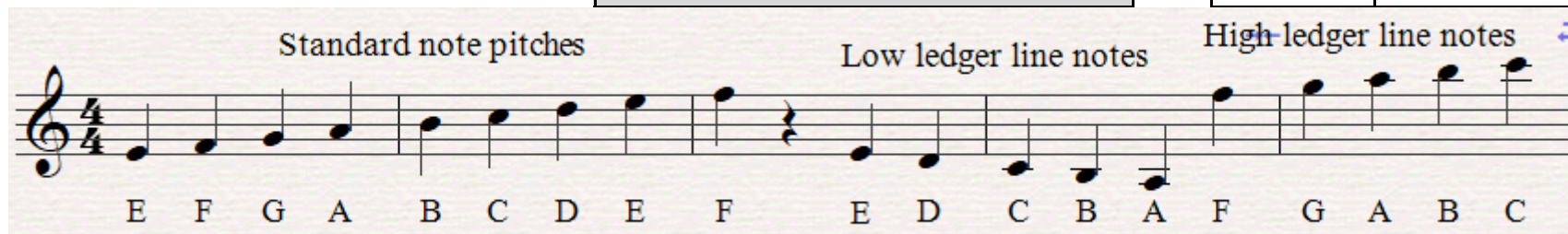

Instruments of the Orchestra

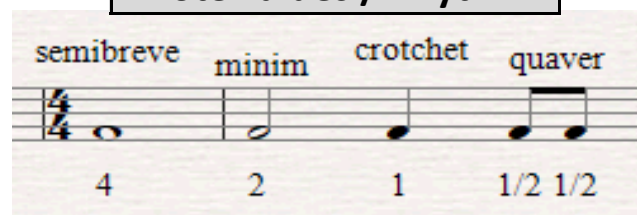
Woodwind	Flute, Oboe, Clarinet, Bassoon

Strings	Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Harp
Percussion	Timpani, Snare drum, Bass drum, Cymbal, Glockenspiel, Xylophone

Semibreve		4 beats
Minim		2 beats
Crotchet		1 beat

Samba

Surdo = large bass drum	Unison = everyone doing exactly the same thing together
Repinique = med drum	Polyrhythm = different rhythms at the same time
Tamborim = v small drum	Call & response = leader plays, the group answer.
Apito = whistle	Cyclic = pattern on a loop
Ganza = shaker	Groove = a settled pattern
Caixa = snare drum	
Agogo = metal cowbells	
Texture = different layers
